WHAT IS SEXUAL VIOLENCE?

- Sexual violence includes rape, sexual assault, sexual coercion and any sexual actions that violate another's personal boundaries.
- Sex without consent is sexual assault.
- Consent cannot be given by someone who is physically or mentally impaired by alcohol/drugs or other condition.

My SOBER YES is my consent.

Sex without continuous consent is sexual assault.

IF YOU OR SOMEONE YOU KNOW IS IN DANGER, CALL 911.

HELP PREVENT SEXUAL VIOLENCE:

- Make a check-in plan with friends before going out.
- Intervene when you see a problem or questionable behavior – confront, distract, or ask for help.
- Help your friends home safely, especially if they've been drinking.
- If you or a friend needs an emergency ride, call a local cab company. Store a number in your phone.

Under Indiana's Lifeline Law, individuals who call for medical help for another person, are the victim of a sexual violence, or witness a crime will not be prosecuted for underage possession or consumption of alcohol, or intoxication if they cooperate with police.
